Need for transportation services when living in senior housing

The first goal should be to keep seniors in their own home as long as possible. This may include the availability of Caregivers, and a transportation service when the senior is unable to drive.

Location within walking distance of full-service grocery/pharmacy; with bus stop.

Activities, both mentally stimulating and physical; open area with comfortable surroundings; an open courtyard; large hot tub; and transportation on call most of the day that is paid for each use or a monthly fee for availability.

1) Develop a step up facility, like Evergreen LCC (assisted living to skilled nursing to hospice). 2) If funding is limited, buy an old hotel, like the one next to Target, or the closed Country Kitchen restaurant and convert it. 3) Don't offer options that compete with existing services, like outpt rehab.

There is a wonderful 8.8 acres of land owned by the Summit Cove Recreation Center, but zoned open space, that if the commissioners were to rezone it would make a wonderful mixed use housing and park area, including affordable housing, senior housing, and market housing.

Parking Space (covered

It would be great to offer the various housing options (i.e. independent, assisted, nursing, etc.) in fairly close proximity to one another. For example, if a couple moved into independent living, and then one of them had to move into assisted living, or nursing care, you wouldn't want your spouse to be located far away as it may be too difficult to see one another.

Summit County is for active people - young and old. If we are not able to take care of ourselves, we should not live here.

Some form of assisted living is definitely needed.

Any project should be sponsored by a creditable health care provider.

These type of housing options SHOULD NOT be supported by taxes. I'm not sure, but it looks like this survey is designed to "identify" another area to spend tax money.

AFFORDABLE by comparison to similar facilities in Denver; middle of the road facilities in Denver. Affordable for multi levels of income; not only high or middle levels,

ACCESSABILITY TO SKILLED INHOUSE NURSING / PARAPROFESSIONAL STAFF

Anything built must be funded entirely by private funds - NO TAXPAYER FUNDS.

Availability of therapies such as Speech, OT/PT and programs for entertainment; church services, van for transportation around the community; options for 1,2, or 3 meals daily, ordering and giving medications, assist in financial and legal matters

Consideration should be given for how any of us as we age can tolerate the altitude. That will be our determining factor for staying in Summit County if we need assisted living. Also, many of our friends have discussed doing assisted living near their children and grandchildren.

Not sure how reasonable this is because most older adults who might need these kinds of facilities start having heart/breathing issues and need to leave Summit County because of the altitude.

Staged care: independent living, assisted care, nursing home care

Skilled nursing and ability to stay in the same place and increase the services instead of having to move to another facility. For example from assisted living to a nursing facility

Although I do not anticipate a need in the near future for such services, we all know things can change in the blink of an eye. There is a significant need for affordable senior housing of some type in Summit County. A combination of independent/assisted living with long term care options would be a good start.

Retirement is 20+ years away for my husband and I, but ALL of the above services and amenities are needed in Summit County. It would be fantastic to have a range of assisted housing options, with the various amenities and medical services.

Walking & Therapy swimming pools are important. Internet/TV/Gardening would be very nice. Room apartments work well for seniors that aren't too mobile.

I think it would be helpful to visit some of the Retirement villages in Denver. We ourselves would rather be in a warmer climate once we can't do all outside activities anymore. The winters are too long in Summit County and the summers are too short.

It would be my desire to have a multi generational housing available for senior and disabled residents.

Some choices in this area will be needed in the next 5 years or so as more baby boomers are attracted to the County.

I worry that any expenditure of resources and land for the 75+ segment of our population may be counter productive. Something seems to happen to this wonderful group of people that makes it very difficult to live here (altitude, winters,???).

Regular and convenient shuttle bus service to grocery stores, medical appointments, etc., if residents cannot or prefer not to drive themselves.

We need something that goes from the patio home independent living to to the far extreme. The questions you are asking are to broad. Each area is so fine tuned. but I do know whatever you offer in extras, they need to be factored into your monthly payment, not piece mill. My Mother has been in this situation for 10 years. The extras mean nothing if you have cheap help who do not listen, or care. The property can be beautiful, but without proper caring staff, to help the people use these spaces, they are just eye candy, and a waist of precious sf. The biggest concern, I see is having unqualified skeleton crews, being paid cheap wages. This is one of the most demanding jobs our world will have to face. Take the money for the window dressing and produce a totally functional space with people that really care and are paid enough to make the difference. The stats in all health care for burn out, and job replacement are huge. Living in this world for 10 years I can see why. I understand that you have to have some extras, to entice your client, however, in the real world, when they get there, and the food is bad, and everyone say, "they will be right back", and no one comes. The extras are not what they remember. The Staff, cleanliness, and food are the most important. There is a prototype, built in Texas, that a close friend built to try an address, what you are trying to achieve. His project, takes a person from the beginning through all the possible happenings in life. As well as were you make your money, how you deal with all the red tape, that comes with this endeavor. And not loose your original mission. It also is a business that the bottom line must reflect the right numbers to exist. I also have a dear friend, who has written a book of needs for this industry, lived this journey, in every area, as well as heads a skilled care project now. I am passionate about the needs and were we are headed as a county and as a community. I am truly thrilled for the conversation. Without this next step in our community, we will loose the opportunity to address the needs of the potential people as well as the existing. This is our world to come and it will not go away. My mother would have been here years ago if the opportunity was available. I am sure, I am not alone. As life goes on the need is only going to grow. The frame work is there to attract the young with the old, and give Summit County another avenue to be a viable force in the future to come. Good Luck, the clock is ticking. #85, should not be other. How about all above

A caring and competent staff is crucial!

Not to fancy, just affordable with the proper care available.

Watch the location so that the residents can walk to a Town Center and have retail, municipal and commercial transactions.

Housing options should also include Medicare Clients. Not cater to only the well to do. Locate the facility in an attractive setting and not behind Alleys and dumpsters

Companion services to take active seniors on easy hikes, skiing etc.

Since most of the people who would live there have fixed incomes, the prices need to stay a set rate.

Stop wasting your money, Seniors won't stay here if they have medical problems & most will. We don't need more housing options. We don't need more government involvement in housing needs. This is a stupid direction. Leave well enough alone.

I'd suggest that you evaluate the elevation factor on seniors still living in Summit County and those who have left! I've been here for twelve years from age 65-77. During that time several friends, couples and singles have left because of altitude and harsh winters. There are several retired physicians living here who would probably be glad to give you an objective opinion on the altitude factor.

Would think that programs at Rec Centers would be the most useful. Possibly short term rehab or out patient facility as well.

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I'll be 59 soon, very active in outdoor activities, my health is average to good, have not put much thought into retirement as of this time.

This area does not lend itself to the very elderly partly because of the cold climate and high altitude.

If the market requests such a housing project so be it- but we are an mswept benefactor for people with health & age concerns and unless we stay still living where we did for years- we should be down the hill I could never support the money for any such project!!

A facility of this nature should be limited to persons that have been residents of S.C. for 15 or more years. Baby Boomers staying here are just coming of age 55-60. People should not move to SC to retire in this facility. They should have a long term investment or family in the community. Due to high altitude or weathering SC is not the best place for most seniors & care could be higher because of it. Exception: This is the best climate for their Health condition. Dementia- Alzheimers= NO! Denver is close enough. The person generally won't know this w/b only for their family convenience. Land s/b used for the worker bees!

If we offer taxes for the school system for upbringing, then we should look out for the elderly who have established residency here for at least the past 15 yrs!
